

Paediatric Presenting Conditions in Primary Care

This series of workshops are designed for people working in primary care services caring for both adults and children.

The workshops will help practitioners to develop their knowledge in the treatment of a range of minor ailments commonly presenting in children. Participants will complete a Clinical Practice Portfolio which will be assessed their own place of work by a practice assessor. This will be accompanied by a reflective case study on a paediatric patient they have provided care for. Subjects included are:

- ⇒ Child Development – anatomy and physiology
- ⇒ History taking, Physical assessment and triage of children
- ⇒ Recognition of red flags
- ⇒ Primary Care management of common presenting childhood conditions
- ⇒ Ethics and legal aspects including documentation
- ⇒ Recognising & responding to the sick child in the primary care environment

Award: 20 credits at Degree level 6 or Master's level 7

Location: Lansdowne Campus, Bournemouth

Entry Requirements: Applicants must be working in Primary care or within a NHS Trust, and should have a DipHE (or equivalent) or undertaken study at a minimum of diploma level

Fee: £875 HEE Wessex will fund a limited number of places.
